#### FY 16/17 Estimates:

(a) Intial budget for FY 16/17 approved by CCP Committee on January 21, 2016.
(a) Budget amounts revised based on updated information received from CA Department of Finance.

#### FY 17/18 Proposed:

(a) Statewide allocation obtained from the detail from the State's proposed budget for Account #5196, 2011 State-Local Realignment, subaccounts 3223 (FY 17/18 base) and 3233 (FY 16/17 growth).

**(b)** County's portion of the Statewide allocation was kept at the same as the actuals for FY 16/17 as notified by the CA Dept of Finance in September 2016.

(c) On January 9th, the fiscal managers from each County department met to discuss 2AF and the 17/18 Proposed Budget. It was agreed to allocate growth at the same percentage as the base. It was also decided to only fund the CCP Coordinator position and not set funds aside for projects. Probation's allocation was adjusted for the position but retains the growth funds. Sheriff's allocation for growth funds was adjusted for the remaining 1%.

(d) Amounts allocated to Local Law Enforcement based on the average number of reported offenders for calendar year 2016 based on the PCS Stats reported by OC Probation for the period of January 2016 to December 2016. Allocation is calculated for those offenders pertaining to Orange County only.

(e) Budget amounts are estimated based on information obtained from the State Budget. Approval of the budget approves the allocation percentages shown and will be used to distribute funds in accordance with County policy.
